





## **Legislative Update**

- Ohio passed HB 489 in April. The law completes a transition from the Ohio Department of Development to the Ohio Development Services Agency. The bill also clarifies contracts between OSDA and JobsOhio and allows the nonprofit JobsOhio to administer loans and tax credits to expand businesses. The bill also creates the Office of Tourism.
- In February, Gov. Kasich signed an executive order creating the Gover-

- nor's Office of Workforce Transformation and the Governor's Executive Workforce Board to create a unified work-force development policy and data collection standard across the state.
- In March, Gov. Kasich signed an executive order giving the Ohio Division of Industrial Compliance exclusive jurisdiction over the construction of shale gas processing plants in the state.

## **Did You Know?**

- According to the JobsOhio third-quarter 2012 report, the nonprofit economic development arm of the state worked with 87 companies that committed to create or retain 22,105 jobs for Ohioans during the quarter. Those projects represent \$1 billion in new capital investment and annual payroll of \$1.1 billion, reports JobsOhio.
- Some 27 rigs are drilling in Ohio's Utica shale.
- Ohio ranks fifth in the nation in intellectual property jobs, according to the U.S. Chamber of Commerce's Global Intellectual Property Center study. Ohio has 2.69 million IP-supported jobs, or about 57 percent of all privatesector jobs in the state.
- Of the 20 corporate headquarters cities in North America surveyed by The Boyd Co. this year, Columbus ranks as the second least expensive. More than 300 corporate managing offices call the area home, including 15 Fortune 1000 companies that base their corporate headquarters in the region.
